The following ports are designated Harbors of Safe Refuge: Arecibo, San Juan, Culebra (Bahia Sardinias), Vieques (Isabel Segunda), Fajardo, Humacao, Yabucoa, Salinas, Ponce, Guanica, Lajas (La Parguera), Guayanilla, Mayaguez, Red Hook Bay, Charlotte Amalie, Cruz Bay, Frederiksted, Christiansted and Limetree Bay. This vessel may not carry passengers between Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands.

If the vessel is away from the dock or passengers are onboard or have access to the vessel for a period exceeding twelve (12) hours in a twenty-four (24) hour period, an alternate crew shall be provided.

Vessel Name: BLUE PARADISE

The minimum number of child-size life preservers is fourteen (14). When more than fourteen (14) persons weighing less than ninety (90) pounds are carried, additional child-size life preservers shall be carried so that the vessel has an approved life preserver suitable for each such person onboard.

A maximum of forty two (42) passengers are authorized on the upper deck.

The master may not act as snorkel guide and must remain onboard the vessel for the entire voyage from the time passengers are embarked until they are disembarked at the final destination.

The required deckhand may serve as snorkel guide only when the vessel is securely moored.

No crew shall enter the machinery spaces while the engines are in operation. Each entrance into the machinery space shall be logged for review by the Coast Guard upon request.
